INTRODUCTION

Vijaya College is founded in 1963 for the education of rural men and women. The First Grade College is affiliated to Mangalore University and has three years B.A., B.Sc., B.Com., B.B.A. & B.C.A. Degree Courses.

The College is sponsored by the Academy of General Education, Manipal.

Vision

A graduate of Vijaya College should be a responsible citizen; with concern for other beings; competent to perform effectively; resourceful; confident and employable; with an open scientific outlook; and with a willingness to contribute oneself and to society.

Mission

Vijaya College will be a centre for learning and development; by not only organising classroom interventions but also extra and co-curricular activities including monitoring, to offer job oriented courses; through hard work, assisted by responsible members of the staff and management; with a disadvantaged attitude, to meet the demands of the students of different caste and class.

FEE REGULATION

1. The academic year is divided into two terms (the first- November to February and the second - April to July). The Fees due in each term may be paid either in one lump sum or in two instalments in the following manner :

I Instalment - October / November

II Instalment - April / May

Details of the College fees payable by the students of the College are put up on the notice board.

2. Each term fee should be paid on or before the last date specified for it by the Principal. Thereafter a defaulter is liable to pay, in addition to the fees proper, a fine of Rs. 1 per day of delay (be it a holiday or working day). If a term fee remains unpaid on the last date specified for the payment of fees with fine, the defaulter's name will be struck off from the College rolls. If re-admitted thereafter, he shall pay a) the fees proper b) the fine for all the days of delay and c) the re-admission fees of Rs. 50/- Re-admission cannot be claimed as a matter of right.

3. The fees paid will not be refunded under any circumstances.

4. Even if a student's name is on the College register for only a part of the term, he is liable to pay the various fees for the entire term.

5. Selection of Candidate for scholarship and fee concessions will be made only on the basis of satisfactory progress, conduct, attendance and economic condition.

6. Scholarship holders are expected to pay the instalments on the specified date and claim their scholarship when it is sanctioned.

Attendance and Leave

1. The working hours of the College are as follows :

Morning session 9.15 a.m. to 12.15 p.m.

Afternoon session 1.15 p.m. to 5.00 p.m.

Some theory or practical classes may be held outside the prescribed working hours, whenever necessary.

2. Attendance is taken every hour at the commencement of the class and a student, who is not in the class at the commencement of each period, shall be marked absent for that period.

3. A student requiring leave for any class after coming to the college should apply in person to the concerned lecturer before the commencement of the lecture.
4. In the case of hostel students, the leave application must be signed by the Hostel Warden.
5. In case of illness extending more than three days the student should produce a medical certificate.

College Examinations :

1. There will be two Internal Examinations for all classes in each semester, the first one of one hour and the second one of two hours duration.
2. In addition to these terminal examinations, lecturers will conduct tests and give assignments to assess the student's progress.
3. No student shall absent himself from any examination or test without obtaining in person, wherever possible, previous sanction of leave from the Principal or in the case of class tests or assignments from the Lecturer concerned. Violation of these rules may result in the imposition of penalties as per the rules of the College.
4. The parents are requested to go through the Cumulative Record regularly wherein the marks of the class tests and terminal examinations of the students are entered.
5. Parents and guardians are particularly requested to supervise the regularity of attending classes and the studies of their wards and co-operate with the Principal and staff in all matters pertaining to the welfare of the students. The Principal will be glad to meet the parents and discuss with them the problem and progress of their children.
6. If a student selected for the award of any scholarship/loan scholarship/fee concession absents from the College examination/test/assignment, he/she shall be liable to the forfeiture of such facility.
7. Parents are requested to attend the Parents - Teachers meet whenever it is convened.

N.B: (For all semester courses)

There shall be theory and practical examinations at the end of each semester, generally during February/ March for odd semesters and during August/September for even semesters.

Attendance

Students are required to put in minimum 75% of attendance in all the subjects in each Semester failing which, they will not be permitted to appear for the University Examination.

Result :

- a) No Candidate shall be declared to have passed the I/ II/ III/ IV/ V/ VI Semester Examination as the case may be unless he/she obtains not less than 35%/ 53% marks in the aggregate of written examination and internal assessment put together in each of the languages and optional subjects (35 marks in case of 100 mark paper and 53 marks in case of 150 mark paper)
- b) In case a candidate fails in either theory or Practicals, he has to appear for theory or practicals of the failed subjects at any subsequent examination and he must obtain the minimum for a pass in that subject (theory and practical separately)
- c) Successful candidates shall be placed in First, Second or Third class, as the case may be.

First class with Distinction and Rank shall be declared only on the basis of the aggregate of marks obtained by the candidate in all the six semesters.

Percentage of marks for declaring Class :

F i r s t c l a s s w i t h D i s t i n c t i o n
: Above 70% aggregate marks.

First Class : Not less than 60% of aggregate marks.

Second Class : Not Less than 50% of aggregate marks.

Third Class : Not less than 35% of aggregate marks.

No. of attempts allowed :

The maximum period for completing a programme shall be

double the duration stipulated for the programme reckoned from the year of admission (including the year of admission) to the programme.

The term 'completing a programme means passing all the prescribed examinations of the programme to become eligible for the degree/diploma. No candidate shall be permitted to appear for the examinations after the prescribed 'Maximum period' for completing the programme.

Voderbet Srinivas Kamath Library

Vijaya College library is named as Voderbet Srinivas Kamath Library. It is accommodated in a three storeyed building. It has vast collection of books about 78,000 volumes on various discipline, besides 78 journals, magazines, daily newspapers etc. A Book Bank is constituted for the benefit of students. Text books are issued under this scheme to the students on a year long basis. In addition to this, reference books are also issued on short term basis. The Library has old volumes, magazines and books for research activities.

Working hours of the library : 8.30 a.m. to 5.30 p.m.

Vijaya College Co-operative Stores :

1. Registered in 1966, this store functions according to the rules of the Co-operative Societies Act.
2. It Supplies all the requirements of students such as books and stationery items. It is in the students own interest to buy their requirements from this store.
3. For the benefit of the students, books and articles are supplied at concessional rates as compared to market price.
4. Xerox facility is provided in Co-operative stores.

Co-curricular & Extra - Curricular Activities :

The College gives considerable importance to co-curricular and extra curricular activities of the students. With the introduction of choice based semester system, participation in co-curricular and extra-curricular activities is mandatory for the students of I and II year.

1. The College provides to its students many opportunities to participate in various co-curricular activities including N.C.C., N.S.S., Red Cross, Rovers & Rangers, sports and games.

2. There are various co-cussicular and Extra Cussicular activity Forums. are open to all students of the College who desire to participate in these activities.
3. There is no election for Students' Forums. Each of these Forums will have one nominated representative and all these representatives of Forums together constitute the executive committee of the Students' Council. One of the Secretaries will be nominated as Co-Ordinator.
4. Various Programmes, Guest lectures, Seminars, Group discussions, Competitions, Exhibitions and Study tours, Project works, etc., are arranged under these Forums.
5. Activities like Music, Dance, Drama, Drawing and Painting, Yakshagana, etc. are organised under Fine Arts Forum.

Eligibility Conditions for the Secretaries of various Forums:-

- A) Should have successfully completed all the subjects/papers of the previous classes.
- B) Should have secured minimum 75% attendance in the previous classes.
- C) No act of indiscipline reported and action taken in the past.
- D) Shall not involve in any kind of indiscipline which will obstruct the rules and regulations of the College.
- E) Shall not interfere with the day-to-day administration of the College in general and disciplinary actions taken by the College authorities against the erring students in particular.
- F) Shall not represent the institution in any matters/ activities outside the College Campus without the permission of the Head of the institution.
- G) Shall not collect funds inside or outside the institution without the permission of the Head of the institution.
- H) Shall not take out any kind of procession either within or outside the College campus.
- I) If any of the above conditions are violated, the Head of the institution reserves the right either to remove such Office bearers or dissolve the associations.

National Cadet Corps :

The College has NCC Army and Naval wings. The training will be given both in military and non military subjects. Both men and women students are eligible to join the training. NCC is an organization governed by the Ministry of Defence, Govt. of India. Selection will be made by a committee depending upon the physical fitness of the students and the available vacancies. The students may however apply for joining NCC through a prescribed application form. The cadets are eligible to appear for 'B' and 'C' Certificate examination only after getting 75% attendance in 1st and 2nd year respectively. However, Committee's decision is final. Students absenting from the parades without valid reason or without getting permission of the Principal or concerned Officers will not be allowed to attend the College classes on the next day.

National Service Scheme :

N.S.S. is a voluntary organisation administered by the University. All students of 1st year degree are eligible to join NSS. However, depending on the availability of vacancies, the selection committee will select the students. All enrolled students will be given 2 years NSS training.

Youth Red Cross :

The 1 year degree students are eligible to enrol under Youth Red Cross which is a constituent of Indian Red Cross Society. It aims at channelising and guiding the youth for humanitarian community service.

Rovers and Rangers :

The College has Rovers and Rangers, the senior wing of Bharath Scouts and Guides. The men students can be enlisted as Rovers and women students as Rangers. The main objective of Rovers and Rangers is the development of full potential of students through outdoor activities and community service campaigns.

Physical Education :

The Department of Physical Education organises various types of sports and games. Separate facilities for men and women students are provided. Besides this, there is Gymnasium and facilities for indoor games like Shuttle Badminton, Table Tennis, Carrom, etc. Students are

required to make use of all these facilities during their leisure hour.

All students of the College are advised to take part in the various Intra-mural games and sports competitions. Coaching camps may be arranged in the College campus for the benefit of promising players in various games and sports.

Placement Cell & Certificate Courses :

The Placement Cell of the College facilitates campus interviews and placement of the students. Short term certificate courses such as Personality Development, Spoken English, Yoga, Sanskrit Speaking Course, Basic Accountancy and Soft Skill development are conducted. Teacher Training Programmes are also organised in the College.

Wall Magazine :

‘Spandana’ is the weekly Wall-Magazine of the College. Selected literary works like Articles, Poem, Painting etc. of the students are published. Literary talents of the students are encouraged through training programmes and contests.

Various Scholarships and Fee concessions are made available to the deserving students. Provision of Scholarships and Fee concessions is subject to good conduct, regular attendance and satisfactory progress.

DISCIPLINE :

1. Irregularity in attendance, neglect of work, insubordination, disorderly behaviour, obscenity in word or act and ragging in any form are punishable in any one of the following manner depending on the gravity of the offence.
 - A) Warning and intimating the fact to the Parent/ Guardian.
 - B) Fine.
 - C) Cancellation of scholarship, freeship etc.
 - D) Suspension for a definite or indefinite period.
 - E) Expulsion.
2. Students are forbidden from taking part in agitations, political or otherwise. Instigating others to violate this rule is punishable by any one of the following depending on the gravity of the offence.
 - A) Cancellation of scholarship/freeship.
 - B) Suspension for definite or indefinite period.
 - C) Expulsion.
3. The College will take serious note of any misbehaviour of the students even outside the premises of the College.
4. Students, who are not living with their parents, are required to reside with relatives or guardians or hostels or lodging approved by the Principal.
5. A) Any activity by the students outside the College Campus such as picnics, tours etc. without the prior approval from the College authorities is strictly prohibited and the Management of the institution shall not be responsible for any untoward consequences following such unauthorised activity.
 - B) It is resolved by the Discipline Committee of the College not to permit the students to organise Orchestra Programme in the

College Campus.

INFORMATION TO PARENTS

- 1. Parent-Teachers' Association :** To monitor the overall progress of the students, Parents-Teachers' Association has been formed and the matters like award of scholarships, free mid-day meal for deserving students, encouragement and assistance to sportsmen, etc. will be taken care of under this forum.
2. Parent - Teachers' Association meeting will be held twice a year on 2nd Saturday during October and February month in order to bring to the notice of parents the academic progress, attendance, other activities, discipline and behaviour etc., of their wards. Intimation in this regard will be served through the students. Parents are requested to attend these meetings without fail and know the attendance and performance of their wards.
3. Free Mid-day meal project for deserving students is in progress. A sum of Rs. 8.00 lakhs is collected so far from donors and well wishers. Parents are requested to contribute liberally and make this project a great success. We have offered this facility to 150 deserving students and it is planned to extend this facility to more students this year.
4. About 36 Endowment Scholarships have been instituted by various organisations for the benefit of students of the College.
5. The College has a well equipped gymnasium for the benefit of the students with morning and evening batches.
6. The Computer Centre offers training in many short-term courses to interested students at subsidised fees of Rs. 1500/- per year.
7. Remedial classes will be conducted by the College for slow learners between 3 p.m. and 4 p.m.

CUMULATIVE RECORD SYSYEM :

Under this system all round progress of the students is supervised through continuous regulation, direction and refinement of students'

curricular and co-curricular activities. Every teacher (Academic Advisor) is entrusted with a batch of students whose all round progress will be monitored by the concerned Academic Advisor.

If the cumulative record is lost or damaged, new cumulative record will be issued on payment of fine of Rs. 25/-

Fixed Schedule for Extra-Curricular activities :

- * Every Saturday afternoon - NCC / NSS / Sports
- * Every Saturday and Sunday - HRD activities / Certificate courses
- * Every Friday afternoon - Extra curricular and co-curricular activities

Note :

1. It is compulsory for the students to bring College Calendar everyday to the College.
2. As per University Rules bringing and using cell phones in the College campus including library is strictly prohibited. If any student is found violating the rule, his/her Cell phone will be confiscated and will not be returned. Provision will be made to deposit the mobile phone in the College Co-operative Stores.
3. All students should wear the prescribed uniform along with ID card. Any student violating this rule will be fined.
4. When a student represents the College in any Inter-Collegiate Competition, NCC, NSS or any other activity, his/her absence must be recorded in the College Calendar (Page No. 46 and 47). This record will have to be produced before the Principal, if a student has less than 75% attendance necessary to appear for the exam.
5. When a student is absent on medical ground, he/she has to submit the medical certificate soon after the recovery to the Principal, to be signed and maintained in the office for reference, in case of shortage of attendance.
